Subject: Allocation of export quota of 87587 MT to willing sugar mills during Sugar Season 2025-26-reg.

I am directed to refer to this Department's letter of even no. dated 13.02.2026 seeking willingness for export of additional 5 LMT sugar during SS 2025-26.

2. In exercise of powers conferred by Section 3 of the Essential Commodities Act, 1955 (10 of 1955) read with clause 6 and 7 of the Sugar (Control) Order, 2025, the Government has decided to allocate an additional export quota of 87587 MT of sugar for sugar season 2025-26 to willing Sugar mills, as per the requests received from them in reference to this office letter No.1(4)/2025-SP dated 13.02.2026, in accordance with the modalities mentioned below:

- i. The allocated quota shall be exported by 30th June 2026.
- ii. Those mills, which would export 70% of their allocated quantity by 30th June 2026, shall be allowed to export the remaining quantity by 30th September 2026. However, if any mill(s) fails to export its 70% allocated quantity by 30th June 2026, then unutilized export quantity of such sugar mill(s) will lapse. DFPD may reallocate or redistribute such unutilized quotas to mills with better export performance or to willing mills.
- iii. The extension of time period shall not be considered except in a force majeure situation.
- iv. The quota cannot be swapped with any other Sugar mill.
- v. Penal clause – Willing sugar mills shall export at least 70% of their allocated quota within the stipulated time. If any sugar mill(s) fails to export the mandated 70% export quantity by 30.6.2026, then the shortfall export quantity shall be deducted from the next export quota of such sugar mill(s). For example, if a sugar mill is allocated 1000 MT of export quantity and exports only 400 MT by 30.6.2026, then the shortfall quantity of 300 MT [difference between 70% of the total allocated quantity & exported quantity till 30.6.2026] will be deducted from the export quota as and when allowed next.

2. All grades of sugar can be exported by a sugar mill /refinery/exporter upto the extent of quantity mentioned in the **Annexure**.

3. Since, raw sugar is either directly exported by a sugar mill or after value addition of such raw sugar by refinery or a mill having a refining capacity and thereafter, it is exported in the form of refined sugar, therefore, customs authorities may allow export of such refined sugar by the refinery / sugar mill/exporter provided that the quantity is within the export quota allocated to a sugar mill. For this purpose the raw / white sugar



manufacturer, the sugar refinery & exporter shall enter into bi-partite / tri-partite agreement.

4. Those sugar mills which have violated the policy guidelines issued by the DFPD order No. 5-1/2024-SC (386427) dated 28.03.2025 for action to be taken against violation of monthly stockholding limit orders for sugar are not being allocated any export quota during current Sugar Season 2025-26.

5. The supply of sugar, by sugar mills to Special Economic Zone (SEZ) refineries up to the extent of export quota as per the instant order will be considered as export.

6. The export of sugar under Advance Authorization Scheme (AAS) may continue as per existing provisions.

7. Where DFPD is of the opinion that it is necessary or expedient to do so, it may, by order and for reasons to be recorded in writing modify any of the modalities for export of sugar.

8. All sugar mills need to upload details of export of sugar on P-II form on DFPD portal namely 'NSWS' on monthly basis.

9. Any violation of the above-mentioned guidelines or breach of quota will attract strict action against the concerned sugar mill/exporter/refinery under the Essential Commodities Act 1955 and the Foreign Trade (Development & Regulation) Act 1992.
